Recreational hunting and shooting activities provide 19,500 local jobs to the economy




The gross contribution to Australia's GDP from recreational hunting and shooting activities in 2018 was estimated to be \$2.4 billion


Recreational hunting and shooting:

- provides an opportunity for participants to engage in physical activity and hunters and shooters are more likely to be active than the general population
 - provides pathways to higher wellbeing for participants through nature connection, self-efficacy, social networks, physical activity and nutrition


Why do people hunt and shoot?








